Special Missions Contribution

FOR THE WHITE STATION YOUTH GROUP

This summer, our teenagers are going to Ghana and Rhode Island to be a part of Kingdom work in those places. Your generosity today will help make it possible for our students to have experiences and serve people whom they would not otherwise meet. The funds allocated to youth missions will help lower the cost of these mission trips for students and adult leaders. Without your help, many would not be able to afford the cost of the trip. Thank you for helping provide faith-building service opportunities for our teenagers!

FOR GLOBAL MISSIONS

Frank Hotorwoshie, our missionary in Ghana, has been evangelizing and planting churches in small villages on the coast of Ghana near the Village of Hope. He uses a motorcycle to get from village to village. It has been our practice to have a joint service on the Sunday that our medical missions team is in Ghana. This year was no different. However, Paul Inkoom, who assists Frank, realized that a man who he had baptized recently did not make the bus hired to bring the people from his village to the service. Using Frank's motorbike, Paul went to bring him to the service and en route had a serious accident. We are very thankful that Paul was not fatally injured. Even though the villagers are extremely poor, they raised as much as they could to assist with Paul's medical expenses, as he has no insurance. Frank had to personally pay for the repairs to the other car and related expenses. We hope that you will participate in the special contribution with open hearts today so Frank can purchase a new motorbike and continue his work in these villages.

FOR MEDICAL MISSIONS

Our medical missions team traveled to Ghana just last month, and they are already making plans for their next trip. The money that is given from today's special contribution will be used to support this trip in many ways. First, it will help fund pre-clinic evangelism done by Frank Hotorwoshie and other local preachers from the five villages where he works. Specifically, it will help with lodging, food, and transportation so that the preachers can evangelize and give out information about our clinics. Next, it will help to pay workers who assist Frank in setting up and transporting the chairs and canopies that are used for the clinics. Lastly, we will use the money to buy medicine and medical supplies for the Mobile Medical Clinics that are held in the five villages where Frank works with local congregations. We thank you for your generosity that helps support our medical work done in Ghana.

FOR CITY MISSIONS

White Station and many of our members have a long-standing relationship with HopeWorks, a local nonprofit that "provides hope and opportunity through education, spiritual development, and respect for work." Last July, HopeWorks moved to their beautiful new headquarters on Summer Avenue to better serve our city. Unfortunately, their new building was burglarized twice last month. While insurance will cover some of the costs, the estimated out of pocket costs are significant. In addition, HopeWorks needs to upgrade their security measures to prevent this from happening again. We hope to encourage and support HopeWorks during a discouraging time by donating toward their recovery efforts from today's special contribution.
