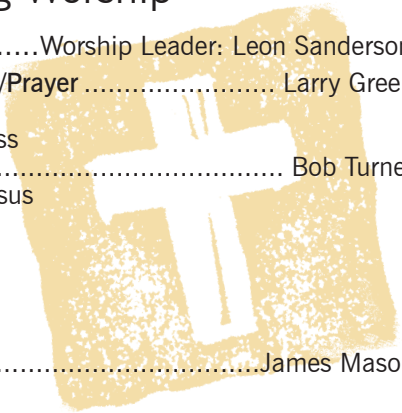

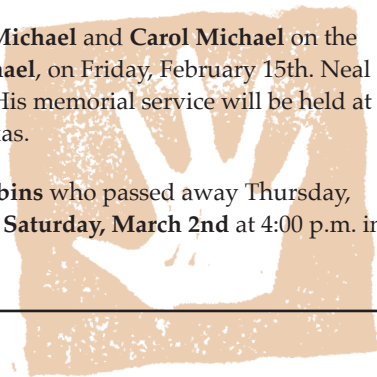

Encouragement from Isaiah

For some of us, the beginning of 2019 has been great. For others, the past two months have left something to be desired. No matter where you find yourself right now, the Lord is there with you. The following passage has been at the front of my mind for the past few days, and I hope you will take some time to read it slowly and deliberately. What beautiful encouragement from Isaiah to the Israelites, and now to us!

But now, this is what the Lord says—
he who created you, Jacob,
he who formed you, Israel:
"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have summoned you by name; you are mine.
When you pass through the waters,
I will be with you;
and when you pass through the rivers,
they will not sweep over you.
When you walk through the fire,
you will not be burned;
the flames will not set you ablaze.
For I am the Lord your God,
the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.
Isaiah 43:1-3



If you are in the chaotic waters, God is with you. If you are walking through the fire, He's there. God has called your name and proclaimed redemption.

This is what the Lord says—
he who made a way through the sea,
a path through the mighty waters,
who drew out the chariots and horses,
the army and reinforcements together,
and they lay there, never to rise again,
extinguished, snuffed out like a wick:
"Forget the former things;
do not dwell on the past.
See, I am doing a new thing!
Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland.
Isaiah 43:16-19

God is doing a new thing. The Lord is at work, whether we see it or not. God continues to work in new and fresh ways, bringing redemption to all. Even in the most desolate place, He makes a way.

May we all rest in the reality of the Lord's consistent provision.
