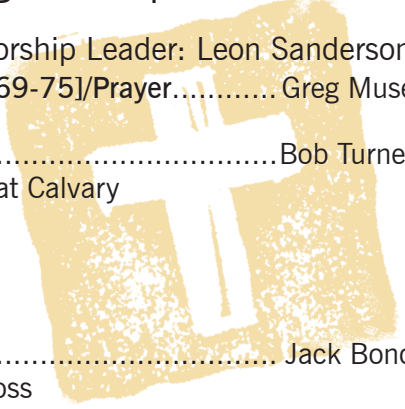

FROM CITY MISSIONS

A Little Bit of Spanish

According to Chris Stewart, a founding member of our Iglesia de Cristo, the story of Iglesia begins with a conversation that Evertt Huffard and Anthony Woods were having about the changing demographics in our city. The year was 1999, and they had noticed an increasing number of Hispanic families in Memphis. They wondered out loud what God was doing in the Hispanic community as well as how the church could be a part of it. Chris happened to be walking by at that moment and overheard their conversation. The next sentence he uttered would begin paving the way for what we now know as our Iglesia de Cristo. Chris simply said, "I speak a little bit of Spanish."

This is reminiscent of a well-known passage in the Gospels where we read about a large crowd that was following Jesus. The book of Mark describes the crowd as "sheep without a shepherd." The disciples wanted to send this tired and hungry crowd away to find food and lodging in nearby towns, but Jesus told the disciples, "You feed them." Andrew spoke up and said, "There's a young boy here with five barley loaves and two fish. But what good is that with this huge crowd?" (John 6:9) I can't help but wonder if Chris Stewart might have felt similarly when he was offering up "a little bit of Spanish."

The story continues, and in Luke 9:16, we are told: "Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up toward Heaven, and blessed them. Then, breaking the loaves into pieces, He kept giving the bread and fish to the disciples so they could distribute it to the people." All four Gospel accounts tell us that not only did the crowd eat until they were full, but the disciples also picked up twelve baskets of leftovers. Jesus took a small, imperfect offering, blessed it, and multiplied it to become more than anyone could have imagined.

In a small home off of Getwell Road on Easter Sunday in April of 1999, Chris Stewart preached to a literal packed house during the Iglesia de Cristo's first official worship service. Since then, Iglesia has grown tremendously, serving as a church home for countless families and individuals as well as a source of encouragement for the Hispanic community. Today, we are overjoyed to celebrate Iglesia's 20th anniversary! This ministry has not only served its members and our city faithfully for two decades, but its impact, through the lives of both former and current members, now extends across cities, states, countries, and even continents. What a testimony to what God can do when we look to Heaven with what we have - even if it only seems like "a little bit."
