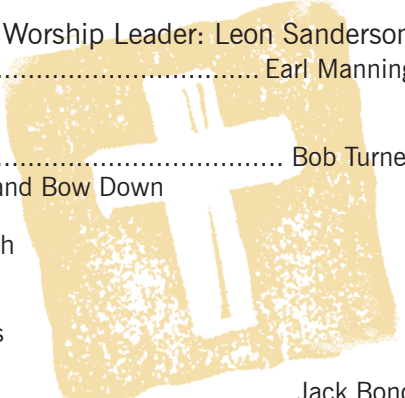

### Vacation Bible School

When I think of attending VBS as a child, I think of running around on the playground and listening to Chadder the chipmunk puppet, learning cheesy hand motions to "Awesome God" and most vividly, the plastic Bible Buddies. Working with children's ministry for the past two summers has given me the opportunity to evaluate and contemplate the purposes of VBS (other than the free childcare and pretzel/marshmallow snacks).

The five rotations of activities are snack, craft, Kid Cinema, games, and Bible story, and each activity has an underlying purpose for social and spiritual growth (grown-ups are sneaky like that). Snacks establish the roots of why communing together as a body has value. Crafts, now called Imagination Station, explores ingenuity and creativity, the link between faith and science, admiring the Creator. Kid Cinema gives the kids a chance to learn about situations where God's word is practiced all around the country and world, and then break into small groups by age to discuss realistic applications. The games and activities we have helps grow the community and build a sense of oneness. Finally, the Bible story, though obvious in purpose and often overlooked in the production of VBS, remains the most crucial and integral part of what we believe: that the Bible is true and inspired by God.

Though VBS is smaller than it used to be, we need volunteers and adults in every crew and rotation to pour into kids' lives. I am thankful to have been brought up in this church by many of the same leaders and volunteers that the children's ministry has now. These kids also need leaders to look up to. The VBS I went to is not the same VBS now; themes are different, hand movements are beyond my ability, and the Bible Buddies have changed, but the intentionality, love, and excitement for Christ are just as strong, if not stronger.

Please check out the giraffe in Fellowship Hall and the lion in the Auditorium lobby today to find how you can help with needed items for this year's VBS. Items for VBS can be returned to your worship venue by **Sunday, June 2nd**.
