### Pick Up Your Mat and Walk

Recorded in John 5 is the story of Jesus' encounter with an invalid by the pool of Bethesda. I have been familiar with the Bible for a long time and have read and re-read the miracles of Jesus for quite some time. I tend to take the first part of this story for granted and focus most of my attention on the brewing tension between Jesus and the Jewish leaders.

Recently though, I was reminded of the power of the first 9 verses (the miracle itself) and what they can mean in my life today. If you recall, Jesus happens upon this man while visiting Jerusalem during a festival. John explains that at certain times an angel would stir the waters of the pool and it would provide healing to the first person who gets in. Jesus takes notice of a man who has been beside the pool for 38 years. The man was always hoping for a miracle but never quite managed to make it to the water in time. Jesus tells him simply to "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." Immediately, he was cured and did so.

At first glance, this seems a pretty routine miracle, if there ever is such a thing. Someone has a problem and Jesus provides a solution. A down-trodden man is experiencing injustice, and Jesus lifts him out of his troubles. Yet, I think there are broader meanings in this story than the mere facts as they happen. Where am I in this story? And what does that mean for the way I live my life?

When Jesus learns of how long this man has been laying by the pool of Bethesda, He asks "Do you want to get well?" It is entirely possible this man has lived off the sympathy and generosity of others for the last 38 years and no longer sees healing as an attractive option. Maybe he views his disability as his meal ticket, so to speak. Without it, he would have to find other means of supporting himself. It isn't hard to imagine someone who has learned to "game the system" and has no actual intention of making it into the healing waters and losing his free lunch. It's also possible he has simply lost the will to try any longer and is content to survive confined to his mat. Either way, Jesus is not willing to leave him there. Seeing the man and confirming his desire to break free of this cycle, Jesus heals the man.

Many times, I have been "confined to a mat" spiritually or emotionally. Sometimes, I am stuck there for a great many years. Too often, I try to make it to the stirring waters by my own designs and through my own power and influence. When I finally encounter Jesus, may I always, by His grace, choose His healing over my own wisdom every time - even when it means everything must change. May I always choose "to walk" in His kingdom and by His power. When others ask me how it happened, may I always give the glory to God.

We just wrapped up a sermon series during the month of May intended to help us bow down to the Lord. By recognizing His power and His splendor, may we always honor His ways before our own. This summer, we are being called, having bowed down to Him, to now Rise Up and serve in His kingdom. Put another way, we are being called to pick up our mats and walk. Let us walk the path before us to His glory.
