Memphis WorkCamp

From the outside looking in, Memphis WorkCamp may seem like an enormous project. And for all intents and purposes, it is. The amount of research, resource pooling, and material gathering it takes to pull off a project of this magnitude may make some veteran handymen shake in their boots. However, the grit and determination that was demonstrated by all those involved in making this dream a reality was simply remarkable.

Over the course of the 31 years that Memphis WorkCamp has existed, over 850 homes have been repainted and repaired. This past WorkCamp saw 17 houses completed thanks to over 200 teens and adult volunteers from seven separate churches hailing from Memphis, Clarksville, Little Rock, and Stillwater.

WorkCamp is many wonderful things, but perhaps its greatest advantage is its ability to create connections and relationships, both with members of other churches and with the home owners, our neighbors who we might easily miss if not for this work. If you in any way helped to make WorkCamp possible, truly, thank you. The transformational power of helping one's neighbor cannot be overstated. Just ask any teen or adult who participated. Bringing the Kingdom of God to the earth is no easy task.

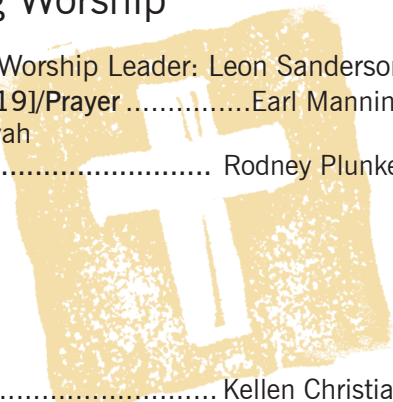

Pray for our Ghana and Rhode Island Mission Teams

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus tells us to go and make disciples (29:19). In the gospel of Mark, Jesus calls us to go and tell the good news to everyone, everywhere (16:15). In the gospel of Luke, Jesus promises to send His Spirit to be with us (24:49). And in the gospel of John, Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you" (20:21).

Two youth group mission teams will live out these gospel passages in the days ahead as they left for Ghana and Rhode Island this weekend. Each mission team member, uniquely gifted by the Spirit, answered His call to be the hands and feet of Jesus in Rhode Island and Ghana. As the sending church, together we are the body of Christ, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, growing in love as each one of us does our work.

The Ghana mission team will be in Ghana, West Africa from June 14 to July 2. They will work with students and house parents at the Village of Hope and the Pearl House. They will also evangelize and serve in the villages in which Frank Hotorwoshie, a White Station supported missionary, preaches. The team's big work project this year is planting 250 trees at the Village of Hope during their visit there!
