"Go Back To Your Country"

This phrase has unfortunately become popular in the last two years. According to social media, it has been said publicly at least 200 times. It has also been said to me at least a couple of times, too.

There are difficult times in our nation right now. There is a hostile environment in our society, and this is where Jesus's light needs to shine more than ever. No, I am not talking about a certain political position, I am talking about showing light in times of darkness.

Many churches are really worried about reflecting the world's light. The church must reflect Jesus's light. Many times, reflecting Jesus's light can mean not being very popular among our society.

To be honest, when I see an immigrant family going through trauma and fear, and when I see their kids being scared to even go out from their homes, I ask myself, "Why do they come here?" I also think, "I would never expose my family that way." However, when I start to listen to the stories of how many of their family members were killed in Central America, and how they feared for their lives and for the lives of their kids, I start to understand. They often say, "We had two options: either die or try to come to this country to start a new life."

It has also been a confusing experience for my family. My kids are American citizens, and Valentina and I have always been under a legal status. We have been contributing to the economy and society of this country since day one of our arrival. Valentina and I are only one year from becoming American citizens. Yet, we get the weird looks when we speak Spanish in public. We have experienced people yelling at us from a car, "Hola amigos!" Unfortunately, it was not necessarily in a friendly way. Our kids ask, "Why do they scream that?" We tell them, "Because they want to be our friends."

Many times when an immigrant is told something like, "Go back to your country," we must remember that this is the only country many of their kids have ever known. This is the home of their children, and they may have never been outside the United States. The kids would not have a place to go back to.

Ultimately, we all wait for and hope to go back to our Heavenly country one day. We will go home to our eternal nation where all of us, all immigrants, will be welcomed by our Lord Jesus Christ. He will never tell us to go back because that will be our home forever.

Regardless of our political views, let us keep showing the love and the light of Jesus to our communities.
