# Reflections on Junior High Camp from our WSYG Summer Interns

For people all across the country, the mere mention of summer camp brings to mind emotions, experiences, and relationships that few, if any, other places can replicate. As a camper of many years, I aspired to one day be the mentor and friend to others that my counselors had once been for me.
