DeafConnect

Everyone here at White Station Church knows I am our minister for the deaf. But what not everyone knows is that I am also the President of the DeafConnect Board. This title was conferred on me after a vote of the Board last November.

By way of explanation, DeafConnect is a non-profit agency that serves the deaf and hard of hearing here in Memphis. DeafConnect provides interpreters for those deaf needing one at the doctor, or lawyer, or education class, etc. DeafConnect also conducts sign language classes for those wanting to learn signs. And DeafConnect provides activities for the deaf like the annual Deaf Family Retreat which this year will be held at Marquette Park, just around the corner from our campus.

The title of President of the Board did not come with big honors. DeafConnect is in the midst of a turnaround. It seems that there was some embezzlement by a former bookkeeper and this threatened the stability of the agency. It also resulted in misunderstandings and ugly rumors among some in the Deaf Community. Talk was that the Board itself had plucked the agency's treasury. At a recent town hall meeting some deaf even asked me if I was paid a fee from DeafConnect. I replied, "Not a cent." In fact members of the Board do not receive pay from DeafConnect. Only staff members are paid. Fortunately a large portion of the Deaf Community understand we are trying to perform the turnaround and to restore all services that we had been giving. For this reason, they support me as the President of DeafConnect Board.

In spite of all this turmoil and confusion, DeafConnect has nearly completed its turnaround! It has already changed to full-time for some of those working at the agency. It is almost ready to interview those wanting the job of CEO of the agency. We will be on more firm footing and will be increasing our services to the Deaf Community.

I look on my work as the President of the DeafConnect Board as an extension of my work as a minister at White Station. Of course I do not preach at DeafConnect, but I do try to represent Christ's love and care to those people DeafConnect serves. They need to see some positives and not to shun the agency that was serving them in the past. Please pray for DeafConnect!
