## Be Still, My Soul

One of my favorite hymns is Be Still My Soul, originally written by Katherine von Schlegel. This hymn has become very important to me over the past few years, specifically because of two lines of the first verse:

*Leave to thy God, to order and provide  
 In every change, He faithful will remain*

One of the things I've struggled with the most is allowing the Lord to fully take hold of my life. I like to have control of things, and I tend to think that I can do things on my own. I've always heard that we are supposed to let God totally control our lives, and I agree with that. I understand that I'm called to lay down my will for the Lord's. Even though I may know this cognitively, it can be really difficult to put into practice.

I've found that I often say to God, "Okay, I'll give you x and y, but I'm going to keep z over here because I know that I can do it better." It's difficult to loosen our grip on the things we feel are the most important. But that's what followers of Christ do. They drop everything and follow. The birds of the air never stress out trying to make sure everything is taken care of, and they still have plenty of food. The lilies of the field aren't busy trying to control everything, yet they are taken care of (Matthew 6:25-34). If the birds and the lilies are able to "leave to thy God," I think it's time that we try to do the same.

No matter how many changes we experience—whether those changes are good or bad, exciting or terrifying, full of joy or wrought with sorrow—God is faithful. And he will remain faithful. This life of faith, with all the giving up of control and letting go of personal desires, is not easy. But it is good. Praise God that he is good!
