God's Church: His Wings for Refuge

I have been thinking about these words in my heart lately: "May the Lord, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge, reward you fully for what you have done." Ruth 2:14, NLT.

These words came from Boaz in the moment that Ruth needed them the most. In the story, Ruth decides to leave her father and mother to follow Naomi, which was not a common thing to see in the ancient culture of Israel or Moab. Nonetheless, she did it. Also, Ruth decides to take Naomi's land, family, and God as her own. In chapter 2, with the blessing of Naomi, Ruth decides to take the risk of going out to look for work. For Ruth, all of these Israelites are just unknown foreigners, as she expresses in 2:10.

However, it seems like God takes her to the right place, exactly where she needed to be (2:3). And most importantly, she discovers what it is like to be in front of welcoming, kind, and loving people like Boaz who only display the character of God.

Ruth is confused. She knows she is only a foreigner, someone unknown, and yet she does not understand why people like Boaz are treating her with great kindness and love, but Boaz's answer is very clear and powerful: "May the Lord, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge, reward you fully for what you have done." Ruth was looking for refuge, security and love, and Boaz provided that not in his own name but displayed God's love. Boaz makes sure Ruth understands she was in the right place, among God's people, with loving, kind and welcoming people who represent "God's wings" as a refuge.

I keep thinking about our visitors. Those friends and neighbors who decide to come for the first time to White Station. Maybe the first time they come to our services to experience God's people they feel like Ruth, strange, as unknown people, as foreigners. I wonder if when they come to church those visitors feel like Ruth when she found God's love through Boaz, under the warm wings of God. It is great when people who come for the first time say, "I feel loved in this church", "I feel included in this church", "they make me feel part of the community here,". It is also very sad when people come and feel ignored, rejected, and feel they don't fit in with anyone in the church.

May this story encourage us to be loving, welcoming, and kind to those who are trying to connect with our community of faith, especially those struggling with their faith. We need to be a community of inclusion, a community of love. We need to be the loving church the world needs. We need to be God's wings serving as a refuge in our society.
